

*Only club sponsor/adult representative may pick up items.

*Students may not pick up entries.

General Rules

Delivery of Entry Items

- Exhibitor items may be brought to the Creative Arts Building at the Loy Lake Show Grounds on:
 - o Monday, February 26th from 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. or
 - o Tuesday, February 27th from 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.
- ONLY leaders or designated club/chapter representatives may enter items on site.
- Qualified Clubs/Chapters will be required to select a check-in time through Sign Up Genius.

Check in Procedures

- The division superintendents and two helpers will be allowed in the building during check-in time.
- Club/Chapter representatives will be allowed in the building during their selected time slot through Sign Up Genius. NO additional volunteers, leaders, or youth will be allowed in the building.
- All entries must be in place no later than 11:00 a.m. on Tuesday, February 27th.

Check out Procedures

- All items will remain on display until completion of the General Exhibits Auction, Thursday, February 29th.
- All items must be picked up between 7:30 pm and 8:30 pm. Thursday, February 29th by the designated leaders or club/chapter representatives.

Entry Requirements

- General Exhibit entries will be accepted from students of Grayson County 4-H, FFA or FCCLA programs, grades 3-12 and communities where teachers and leaders assist in formulating and carrying out plans for General Exhibits Division of the Texoma Exposition and Livestock Show.
- In order to qualify, a teacher or leader must attend planning meetings and work as directed by the planning committee during show time in this division. No entry will be accepted from schools or clubs outside Grayson County.
- Each Qualified Club/Chapter with exhibitors MUST sign up for a time window on Wednesday or Thursday to stay and keep the Creative Arts Building secure and open for the public to come and view projects. Time slots are selected through Sign Up Genius.

Exhibition Grade Divisions

- Entries are judged and displayed in two categories per division:
 - o Grades 9-12 as of show date (Senior Division)
 - Grades 3–8 as of show date (Junior Division)

Entry Submissions

- All items that are being submitted for the General Exhibits show must be registered online at https://grayson.agrilife.org/telsgeneralexhibits.
- Deadline for registration of all items is Monday, February 19, 2024 by 11:59 p.m.
- Unregistered entries will not be accepted.

Regular Entry Fee

- Entry fee for all divisions will be \$5.00 per item.
- Entry fees are due when items are brought to the General Exhibits building
- Entry fees are due when checking in items.
- No items will be accepted without entry fee.

Late Registration

- There is an additional \$10 late registration fee per entry if a student MUST register late.
- Online late registration will ONLY be allowed from 8:00 am on Tuesday, February 20th until 12:00 pm on Wednesday, February 21st. No exceptions will be made.

Judging Time

- Judging will begin promptly at 11:30 am on Tuesday, February 27th. No one will be allowed in the building during judging.
- NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER 11:00 AM.

Superintendent Discretion

The superintendents and planning committee chairman will have the final decision on all entries. Division superintendents are responsible for entries or rejections in their specific division. Superintendents are responsible for printing the entry submission sheets, score sheets or comment sheets for their division to be used by judges. All superintendents will be responsible for seeing that Champions are contacted about participation in auction.

Preparing for Check-in

All boxes, containers, food covers, trash, etc. will be removed by teachers and leaders after entries are checked in by superintendents.





The superintendents and planning committee chairman will have the final decision on all entries.

General Exhibits Awards

All entries will receive one of the following awards:

- Grand Champion: Purple Rosette
- Reserve Champion: Pink Rosette
- Finalist: Purple Entries considered for Grand/Reserve Champion
- Excellent: Blue ribbon Entries receiving 91-100 points
- Good: Red ribbon Entries receiving 81-90 point
- Participation: White Entries receiving 80 or less points

Entry Requirements

- Items or projects to be entered must have been made within the past year solely by entrant, and may be in the following divisions: Art, Clothing, Crafts, Floral Design, Food, Knives, Needlework, Photography, and Woodworking.
- NO ENTRIES FROM PREVIOUS TEXOMA EXPO YOUTH FAIRS ARE ELIGIBLE

Scholarship Eligibility

- All scholarship applicants must have entered the Texoma Exposition and Livestock Show General Exhibits Division at least TWO years (grades 9-12) to apply for a scholarship through the General Exhibits Division.
- Deadline for scholarship applications is noon on Thursday of show.
- Scholarship applications are available online to all seniors during registration of entries or from club/organization sponsors.

Live Auction Items

Grand and Reserve Champion items will have the opportunity to be auctioned on Thursday evening. Proceeds will be retained by winners. Food winners will need to prepare fresh items of the identical recipe entry for auction.

- All Grand and Reserve Grand Champions participating in the auction must be present for the auction or have a representative present to carry the item into the ring.
- All champions participating in the auction must be in the General Exhibits building by 5:30 pm on Thursday for auction information and lineup. The auction will begin at 6:30 pm in the small arena.

Payout Procedures

Exhibitor auction money will be received at the evaluation meeting following the show. "Add-on" money paid to the General Exhibits Association will be added to the exhibitor's check. Add-on funds "paid to exhibitor" cannot be paid out by the association.

Division Guidelines

- Artwork must be appropriate for family viewing.
- Entries MUST be matted or framed, with the exception of wrapped canvas.
- All entries (including wrapped canvas) MUST have a wire hanger and be ready for hanging. Entries not complying will not be accepted.
- No names or signatures can be visible on the front of art work. It is the exhibitors responsibility to cover their name prior to check-in at the show (if the name was already on the piece)

Artwork is not accepted if made before March 2023.
NO GLASS ALLOWED



Division Guidelines

- All garments must be clean and must have been made within the past year solely by the entrant.
- Garments must be free of rips and tears, in excellent wearing condition, and completely finished.
- Garments must be entered on hangers.
- All items need to have threads clipped prior to entry.

Division Guidelines

- All designs must be the work of the student
- Maximum two entries per exhibitor
- Entries must be floral projects; silk arrangements must have silk flowers only.
- Silk and Dried Arrangements must be no more than than 14" tall and 18" wide



Division Guidelines

- Food must be exhibited with clear plastic wrap or clear disposable covers. No colored plastic wrap or colored disposable covers. No bakery boxes allowed.
- INDIVIDUAL SERVING ITEMS MUST CONTAIN AT LEAST 12 NORMAL SIZE SERVINGS.
- No side items will be accepted with entries.
- Items should be displayed in appropriately sized containers.
- All entries must be homemade.
 - A mix may be used if 3 or more ingredients are added other than those required by the basic recipe.
- Recipes must be typed on an 3x5 index card and turned in with their item. All recipes cards must have DETAILED ingredients and full instructions to be eligible for entry. Only print on the front side of the card. Staple cards if using more than one.
- Recipe instructions MUST be written in the student's own words.
- Entries must NOT require refrigeration to maintain freshness.
- No fresh fruit, perishable décor, Cool Whip, cheesecakes or whipped cream.
- It is NOT recommended that the food items be eaten after the show.
- All entries will be cut, tasted and judged on taste as well as appearance. Canned foods will not be tasted.
- Decorated cakes may be made from a cake mix, however, decorated cakes will be cut, tasted and partial score will come from overall taste.



Division Guidelines

- All photographs must have been taken since the previous year's show and must be the original work of the entrant.
- Photographs from the internet or photographs of another photograph are not acceptable.
- Photographs must be presentation ready –securely mounted on sturdy backing, neatly matted or mounted edge–to–edge, with plastic hanger attached.
- Photo prints may be 5×7 inches or 8×10 inches, with finished display being no larger than 11×14 inches, with no more than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch thickness.
- There is a limit of 2 entries per student.
- Photograph detail form must be completed as part of online entry.
- NO prints on metal, glass, or wood are allowed. No glass or frames are allowed. No date, time stamp, or name allowed on photo front.




- Wood furniture only-other than the hardware or trim

- Refinished Wood/Metal items

Division Guidelines

- All entries should be clean and finished for display.
- No outside assistance or work by anyone other than the student is allowed. Adult supervision is always welcome and advised.
- Must be a single person project.
- Exhibitors will need to submit a one-page Summary with before and after pictures and a description on the process they used.
