**Division Rules:** All entries are subject to the General Rules and these additional rules

The dairy goat show will be pens, pending the availability in the goat and lamb barn. If pens are made available all goats will be required to be in a stall. No use of pinch collars. Show chains or nylon collars only, no halters.

**OWNERSHIP:** Registered dairy goats must have ownership in the exhibitor's name. Commercial does (non-registered) must present POS (point of sale) slip which includes the date purchased, age of the doe, and breed of parents. Does must have been continuously cared for and fed personally by the exhibitor since the date of purchase.

Does in milk should not have over-extended udders; it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure they are shown with the appropriate amount of milk in their udders.

The following recognized dairy breeds or crossbreeds are eligible to show: Alpine, LaMancha, Nigerian Dwarfs, Nubian, AOP, and Recorded Grade. Commercial does (non-registered) will be shown in the Recorded classes. Three dairy goats of a breed must be entered by two or more exhibitors to justify a breed show, otherwise, they will move to AOP.

Standard health papers are not required, but common sense prevails. Sick or injured goats will be asked to leave the barn and any entry fee forfeited. Check with your vet. *PLEASE NOTE: Any animals with lumps or abscesses or otherwise ill in the opinion of the show committee, will be quarantined and not allowed to show with all fees being forfeited.*

Dairy does must be winter-clipped prior to arrival at the show. Please refrain from full-body clipping.

**Exhibitor Attire:** White shirt with a collar (long or short sleeves) and white or dark pants. No midriff-showing, no low-cut blouses, no see-through blouses will be allowed.

Division classes based on the age of the doe, as listed on their registration papers and teeth/ point of sale slips for commercial does. Grand Champion & Reserve Grand Champion winners based on ear tattoos, chips, or tag numbers.

## Dairy Goat Show Classes (Show order is subject to change):

**Senior Doe Division (Milking Stock)** - Any doe over 24 months must show in Senior Doe classes. Any doe that has not kidded and is over the age of 2 cannot be shown.

- 1 Does, Yearling Milker's
- 2 Does, 2 years and under 3 years
- 3 Does, 3 years and under 5 years
- 4 Does, 5 years and over

**Junior Doe Division (Dry Stock)** - Any doe under 24 months (two years) that is NOT in milk and has never freshened.

- 1 Junior Kids - Under 6 months
- 2 Senior Kids, 6 - under 12 months
- 3 Junior Yearlings, 12 - under 18 months
- 4 Senior Yearlings, 18 - under 24 months
